## **D9.7 FINAL REPORT ON AMIDA TRAINING ACTIVITIES**

**PHIL GREEN AND GILLIAN CALLAGHAN, USFD**

### **Abstract:**

The aim of WP9 was to spread excellence by providing training for young researchers within the main AMIDA programme. The main activity was in supporting extended visits by researchers to AMI DA labs to work within the project's research scope. 47 such placements took place in Amida, following about 40 in the precursor project AMI. In addition the AMI training programme supported the Euromasters scheme in language and speech, the MLMI conference and several workshops. We organized a Training Day in June 2007.

## 1 Introduction

The aim of the AMIDA training programme was to spread excellence by providing training for young researchers within the main AMIDA programme. The major training activity was to support placements for researchers to work in AMIDA labs on projects which are AMIDA-related. In addition, the AMIDA training programme arranged network-wide tutorials for the trainees, provided support to the Euromasters Scheme in Language and Speech and sponsors young researchers from AMI labs to attend the MLMI conference and several other AMIDA-related workshops

The AMIDA training programme was managed by Professor Phil Green of USFD. Prof Green chaired the AMIDA training panel, whose 5 members directed the programme, with part-time help of an administrator at USFD, Gillian Callaghan. The home page for the training programme is

## 2 The placement programme

The AMIDA placement programme was available to researchers at all levels, from undergraduates to post-docs. It paid travel costs and living expenses, not salary: applicants were expected to be studying or employed at a 'home' institution. Living expenses were €1,250/month for European hosts and €2,000/month for ICSI placements. Travel costs were allowed on the basis of the cheapest available flights or trains.

The placement programme was open to researchers outside the AMIDA labs, and to researchers outside Europe. There were no restrictions on placement length, 6 months – 1 year was typical and less than 3 months unusual.

The application process was as follows

- Applicants applied using a form downloadable from the web site,
- They had to describe the project they want to do and why,
- They required statements of support from their home lab & their prospective host lab, together with an academic reference and CV,
- Applications were considered by the training panel on (at least) a quarterly basis,
- A budget was negotiated for each successful applicant on an individual basis,
- At this point a formal offer was made and payments set up.

Researchers on placement were allocated supervisors at their host lab and required to produce reports at the end of the placement, and to fill in a feedback questionnaire. Abstracts of the work in each placement, and photographs, were required early in the placement and posted on the AMI web site. At the end of a placement researchers received an AMI Training Certificate signed by the training manager and the host institution.

## Placement statistics

Table 1 overleaf details the placements which took place. Note that some placements overlapped between AMIDA and its processor AMI.

In summary,

- 51 students applied and 47 took up placements.
- Of these 47,
  - IDIAP hosted 15 placements, ICSI 13, UEDIN 6, USFD 7, BRNO 2, UT and DFKI 3 each, TNO and TUM 1 each,
  - There were 5 postdocs, 14 PhD students, 17 masters students, 8 undergraduates and 7 on the ICSI Scheme.
  - 12 researchers on placement came from other from AMIDA labs and 39 from outside.
  - 21 nationalities were represented. There were 29 European trainees and 18 non-European. The highest number of trainees from a single country was 9, from India, followed by 5 from Germany and 4 from Holland and China.

### 3 Other Activities

We supported the Euromasters scheme in Language and Speech(<http://www.cstr.ed.ac.uk/emasters/>), which allows students in participating institutes to gain an additional qualification, signed by professional bodies. To do this, they must spend at least 1 semester outside their home institution, engaged on a language/speech project. In addition, they must attend a Summer School which was organised annually. AMIDA gave €5K to support this Summer School in 2007 and 2008. The Summer School was also available to AMIDA trainees.

We organized an Amida training day, on 30 June 2007, for the benefit of AMIDA trainees and other interested researchers. This took place in Brno, between the MLMI workshop and the Euromasters Summer School. The programme consisted of a series of overview tutorials covering the different aspects of AMIDA – the technical work packages and knowledge transfer activities. The attendance was around 30.

### 4 Budget

The AMIDA training budget was increased to €550K (€458k without overhead). The expenditure is likely to exceed this, and will be covered by USFD's RTD budget. (Figures to be confirmed after Y3 audit).

An approximate summary of spending on the training programme is as follows:
