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## Look into the future

- Sophisticated life ==> context separation, context connection, context switching
- We will see more deployment of biometric systems, probably not only because of Big Brother wants to do so, but because of the sophistication of our day life.

## Look back at the history

- Simon's historical examples conform to what Richard mentioned: Users are the weak link.
- What have the users done wrong:
  - Neglect or selective use of modalities (in Simon's examples)
  - Lack of independent checks (in Simon's examples)
  - Lack of education ==> abuse, misunderstanding
    - e.g., identity for sale initial difficulty encountered by Taiwanese National Health Insurance system. Another form of spoofing.
- Stakeholders are the weak links: users & designers (low acceptance of the IRIS at UK airports)

## Back to the future again

- Multimodal biometrics & data fusion
  - Curse of dimension, dimension reduction
- Characterisation of spoofing
  - Technical aspects
  - Social aspects, e.g., abuse due to digital divide / education divide
- It is not whether we want it or not, but how we are going to use it properly.
- When ID becomes a necessity, people will accept it.
